You have the option to request that Site-Resources maintain your web content for an annual fee. If you choose to do so, you will correspond with the Site-Resources team on a regular basis and they will input your content to your WordPress site. You can do this yourself at no cost. AAUW Site-Resources will set up one "Editor" and up to five "Contributor" accounts for your Branch/State site. EDITOR- Someone who will publish and manage posts and pages, and manage other users' posts, etc. CONTRIBUTOR- Someone who will write, submit, and manage posts, but not publish them.

ZOOM

AAUW Maryland purchased ZOOM PRO (https://zoom.us/), which provides video and audioconferencing options for up to 100 users with no time limits on the meetings.

The Governor declared a state of emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic as of March 2020. We were able to host the 2020 Convention on Zoom and have held AAUW MD Board Meetings throughout this year using Zoom.

Several Branches have set up their own Zoom accounts, and the State Zoom account is also available for branch use. Only one meeting can be scheduled at the same time. Alternatively, an individual or branch can get a free, "Basic" Zoom account. It can be for free for one-on-one meetings of any length and for 40-minute meetings for up to 100 participants.
