Begin at 9 with half an hour of **networking, coffee/tea, and snacks**. President Tracy Lantz will open the program at 9:30. The morning will include not only **three distinguished guest speakers** but also time for discussion. **Leadership Training activities will focus on new officers and will include guidance on using the tools available via the AAUW Website**. **Lunch will be provided**, offering increased opportunities for networking, mentoring, discussion, and catching up with friends (old and new). The **business meeting** after lunch will conclude by 3:30 p.m. We are most pleased to tell you a little about the guest speakers:



Dr. Modupe Agueh, MD, Director, Bureau of Clinical Services, Baltimore County Department of Health and Human Services, will speak on **Representation and Inclusion: Understanding the Impact of Social Determinants of Health**. Dr. Agueh is an obstetrician/gynecologist with a passion for public health. Born and raised in Washington DC, she moved to Benin, W Africa with her family at age 11. During those years she developed an appreciation for resource limitations and variations in resource allocation.

After obtaining a bachelor's in science (microbiology and immunology) at McGill University in Montreal, she earned an MPH in epidemiology at GWU in Washington DC. This was followed by medical school at Emory University in Atlanta, GA. She has resided in Baltimore since starting her Ob/Gyn residency at Johns Hopkins.



Dr. Khara Simpson, MD, Associate Program Director for the Fellowship in Minimally Invasive Gynecology at Johns Hopkins Hospital, will speak on **Racial and Ethnic Inequities in Gynecological Care**. Dr. Simpson is a board-certified OB/GYN who began her medical journey at Hampton University in Virginia, followed by medical school at Howard University in Washington DC. She completed OB GYN residency at Johns Hopkins, where she developed a passion for the surgical care of women. This led to her pursuing and

completing a three-year fellowship in minimally invasive gynecology at Columbia University. She rejoined Johns Hopkins as a faculty member in 2016. She now serves as one of the vice chairs for quality and safety for the department as well as the associate program director for the fellowship in minimally invasive gynecology.



Dr. Jenny Robinson, MD, MPH, PhD, Asst. Professor, Div. of Family Planning, Johns Hopkins School of Medicine will speak on **Inequities in Reproductive Health Services**. Dr. Robinson is a board-certified gynecologist and obstetrician who specializes in family planning and general obstetric and gynecologic care. She also has earned several awards for excellence in teaching. Dr. Robinson completed fellowships in both complex family planning and clinical pharmacology at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, as well as a PhD

in Clinical Investigation at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. She previously completed residency at Drexel University, earned her medical degree and a master's degree in public health from Tulane University, and has an undergraduate degree in biology and English literature from the University of Virginia.

Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion Spotlight – July 2022

Even better, I could say "When one door closes, another one opens." After serving as AAUW Maryland's Chair of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DE&I), I am moving on to another role. Heather Reichart and I are now serving as Co-Vice Presidents (Co-VPs) of Programs at AAUW Maryland. The role of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Chair is now filled by Carolyn Fisher,

Ph.D., M.S.

Dr. Fisher is a Senior Science Writer and is a trained Cancer Biologist and Radiation Researcher. She is currently an active member of the Gaithersburg Branch. She has been the branch's VP of Programs and has participated in AAUW Lobby Corps. AAUW Maryland is excited to welcome Carolyn as the new DE&I Chair. You will see and hear more from her as AAUW Maryland rolls out new and informative DE&I programs throughout the new fiscal year.

Since I stepped into the role of DE&I Chair back in 2019, many events occurred that impacted DE&I programming at the State and Branch level. At the Summer Meeting held in Frederick MD in July 2019, participants were provided training in DE&I principles and practices by DE&I expert D. Bruce Stewart. Many programs at the State and Branch level which focused on DE&I were prompted by the murder of Mr. George Floyd (captured on video) in May 2020 by a Minneapolis police officer. This grave incident led to protests around the world calling for justice and reforms to end systemic racism. Faced with curtailed in-person meetings due to the COVID-19 pandemic, AAUW Maryland branches offered virtual programs such as "Moving Forward with Black Lives Matters," and screening of documentary films such as *13th* in August 2020 and *The Lakota Daughters* in February 2021. Other events, such as our Spring Convention in May 2021, which focused on "The Power of Women Voters," the "Women's Equality Day" event held in Garrett County in August 2021, and more recently, the Spring Conference held in Annapolis in MD in March 2022, which focused on the 50th Anniversary of Title IX, all touched on issues affecting DE&I.

In our roles as Co-VPs of Programs, both Heather and I will lend support to Carolyn as she plans and executes DE&I programs at the State level. Please welcome Carolyn and contact her with your thoughts or ideas regarding the DE&I programs for the next fiscal year. It has been a pleasure to serve you!

AAUW Funds Reports

Congratulations, AAUW Marylanders!

Thanks to your personal generosity and innovative fundraising, AAUW Maryland once again earned the right of Platinum sponsorship of the Women of Distinction award ceremony, the crowning event of AAUW's annual National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL).

Individual donations, modest and munificent, brought in much of the income, but we also enjoyed, and profited from, a lovely afternoon tea honoring Dr. Pat Stocker, which put us over the top. A delightful silent auction of donated goods and services, spearheaded and implemented by Anne Arundel Branch members at our Annapolis convention, allowed us to fund, in addition, scholarships for NCCWSL attendees. We exceeded our numerical goal of nine, chosen to accentuate the 50th anniversary of Title IX, the convention theme. My warmest thanks to all who contributed to these efforts, especially to all whose leadership roles made them possible.

As you know, our reward for providing the qualifying \$20,000 was to name our own AAUW Maryland Woman of Distinction—for 2022, Dr. Pat Stocker, academic and business executive, volunteer on national boards, and the state and branch AAUW leader we've all come to know and admire.

Sadly, NCCWSL 2022 was again held virtually. Two nationally chosen Women of Distinction were featured—both young Black women of stellar accomplishment.

Dr. Raven Baxter, an educator, molecular biologist, and charismatic public speaker merges science with pop culture (she sings, dances, and designs STEM-themed apparel) to entertainingly teach science to

broad audiences. "Dr. Raven the Science Maven" is recognized on *Fortune* Magazine's 40 under 40 list and *Forbes*'s 30 under 30. For her, success and fulfillment come from being one's whole, authentic self.

Kristin Henning, J.D. Harvard, teaches law at the Georgetown University Law Center and directs its Juvenile Justice Clinic and Initiative. She represents DC youth in delinquency cases and trains state leaders on the impact of racial bias in the juvenile and criminal legal systems. Her new, lauded book is *The Rage of Innocence: How America Criminalizes Black Youth*. She urged the attendees to imagine how society *should* look years from now, in order to best address the necessary steps for getting there.

Pat Stocker opened the event with her story of growing up in Fargo where, as heir to her father's musical talent, she developed her skills in piano and voice. She credited her mother's promotion of the scientific method for her own curiosity and pursuit of the new, as well as a willingness to tackle and solve problems. As she highlighted her multifaceted career and life experiences, Pat repeatedly emphasized the importance of women supporting other women.

Pat then left the screen but, unexpectedly, she was called back to participate with the others in an inspiring interview session with AAUW Chief Executive Gloria Blackwell. Without missing a beat, Pat responded thoughtfully and in depth to issues ranging from how to stay on course during a pandemic to envisioning the best way forward for women. Among many perceptive suggestions, she advised her viewers to not approach their first jobs as a lifetime decision, and to seek a field that opens more, not fewer, doors. Thank you, Pat, for doing us proud!

Within the obvious limits of Zoom, these Women of Distinction presented an engaging and useful program for the many tuned-in college women student leaders. **Thank YOU, AAUW Marylanders, for making it happen!**

Membership Report

As I write this Membership Report, I know that some of you have expressed difficulty in using the new AAUW Association site for renewing your membership or those of your Branch members. In the past you were familiar with the Member Services Database. Now

the new system is called "The Community Hub" and it replaces the old MSD as well as multiple other database systems.

The Community Hub function is the main system for affiliate leaders to enter and access information on affiliate members, officers, and donations from their members. It is also the main system for individual members to access their own information, including branches joined, educational information, committee membership, and length of AAUW membership. It is also the main database across the entire organization.

For example, if you are a president, membership vice president or finance officer, you can access the branch roster through your personal snapshot page and choose MY AFFILIATIONS. Click the blue button to the right and choose MANAGE ROSTER. Click EXPORT ROSTER to download and view member status.

If you need additional help, you may visit the Community Hub Tools and Resources page for more detailed information and training videos. If you still need help, feel free to reach out to me and I will help direct you to the appropriate person.

I am looking for someone who would like to lead the MD Online Community. I am willing to help gather ideas from other Online Branches in other States. Please reach out to me if you know of anyone who might want to help with this project.

AAUW's STEM-Ed for Girls has returned for the summer of 2022! AAUW's STEM-Ed for Girls is for middle and



high school girls—with a particular focus on girls of color—who are just starting to explore their interest in science and math or have already decided to major in STEM in college. Each week, June 1 – July 22 the girls virtually explore a different subject area they can choose as a college major, including biology, chemistry, physics, engineering, mathematics, and technology/computer science. The program includes special sessions for parents, guardians and caregivers who are eager to provide the support and encouragement that girls need.
