Welcome to AAUW Maryland's 2023 Summer Conference

The theme for this year's AAUW Summer Conference will be **The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA)- Then and Now. This timely topic is pertinent when we remember that** the Equal Rights Amendment has not yet been officially added to the U.S. Constitution as the 28th Amendment! This amendment was proposed more than 100 years ago and the thirty-eight state ratification requirement was finally met in 2020 (Virginia being the 38th state). However, red tape and politicians continue to stall the effort to add the amendment to the Constitution.

The Harford County AAUW Branch is hosting this year's conference at the Unitarian Universalist Church in Bel Air and is excited to welcome you to our county.

Program: Following a continental breakfast, the day will begin with an entertaining performances and thoughtful presentations from **Maureen Broy**, a professional vocalist and ERA advocate, who sings about and discusses her family's historical involvement in the suffrage movement.

We'll also hear from **Mary Ann Gorman**, the leader of Maryland NOW's ERA Taskforce, on what direct action we can take to further the advancement of the Equal Rights Amendment. Following that presentation, Harford County Branch member, **JoAnn Macdonald** will provide information about and lead a discussion on Patsy Mink, the first woman of color elected to the U.S. House of Representatives and the first Asian-American woman to serve in Congress.

This information will provide material for lively discussion over a lunch provided by Panera.

The afternoon session will consist of a Diversity and Inclusion presentation that dovetails with the fight for equality for all, and a State Board business meeting.

All members are encouraged to stay and participate. We look forward to connecting with many Maryland members. Please feel free to bring interested friends and family.

Logistics: The Unitarian Universalist Church is easy to get to if you are traveling North on I95. Just take the ramp for exit 80 (Belcamp) and turn left at the light onto Rt. 543. Go approximately 6 miles until you get to Rt. 22. Turn right and follow the road for 2.5 miles until you see the church on the right side of the road.

If you are traveling a distance to attend the meeting, there are two hotels located minutes away from the conference site in Bel Air. The Hilton Garden Inn (410- 306-7800) is located right off I95 in Aberdeen at 1050 Beards Hill Rd in Aberdeen, MD and is a ten-minute ride down Rt. 22 to the Unitarian Universalist Church in Bel Air. Another option is the Country Inn and Suites by Radisson (443 345-4362) located off I95 in Belcamp at 1435 Handlir Dr, Bel Air, MD 21015.

After the conference you may enjoy a walk down Main Street in Bel Air, or through the historic Havre de Grace downtown. Both small towns have many interesting sites and restaurants. associated with adverse outcomes of pregnancy. One third of deaths related to pregnancy come in the first year after delivery. She encouraged listening carefully to new mothers, checking on how they are doing, and responding to

what they need—e.g., do the laundry, provide food. **Dr. Nicole Kumi** (right) movingly explained her own experience with postpartum depression, both before and during the pandemic. She reminded us it can be very difficult for women to recognize their own needs and to ask for help. She encouraged focusing on the mom, not just asking to hold the baby. Help wash and clean. Her book, *Postpartum My Language: My True Account of the Fourth Trimester*, is available online to help women understand and cope with their own and others' trauma.

Many thanks to the Program Vice Presidents and to the Howard County Branch team who hosted the 2023 AAUW Maryland Convention on April 15, 2023, at Howard County Community College. Speakers were outstanding, and the venue and food couldn't be beat. Howard County Executive **Dr. Calvin Ball** (photo with Branch President Beth Hayden and State President Tracy Lantz) welcomed us with appreciation for AAUW's

leadership, service, and dedication. We learned important information about the "fourth trimester"—issues facing women after giving birth. In a spirited presentation, **Dr. Jameta Barlow** (left)noted that race is a social construct that is statistically

EPA Invites Youth to Serve on National Environmental Youth Advisory Council

On June 22, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the formal establishment of the agency's first- National Environmental Youth Advisory Council (NEYAC). The NEYAC will provide independent advice and recommendations to Administrator Michael S. Regan on how to increase EPA's efforts to address a range of environmental issues. The NEYAC will provide a critical perspective on how the impacts of climate change and other environmental harms affect youth communities.

EPA is soliciting applications for youth to fill 16 vacancies on the NEYAC. Selected applicants will contribute to a balance of perspectives, backgrounds, and experience of the council and will be appointed by the Administrator. All members of NEYAC will be between the ages of 16 and 29. As part of the agency's commitment to centering environmental justice communities, at least 50% of the overall membership of NEYAC will come from, reside primarily in, and/or do most of their work in disadvantaged communities as defined by the Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool (CEJST) as part of Justice40.

Applications to the NEYAC are due by August 22, 2023 at 11:59PM ET. To apply for appointment to the council, the below information is required:

- Contact information
- Resume, short biography, or qualification essay
- Statement of interest
- Explanation of your point of view using your chosen media (various options)

EPA will be hosting a virtual application webinar where the public can ask EPA staff questions live. The webinars will be on Zoom and will be held Monday, August 7, 2023 @ 12PM – 1PM ET // Register here
